

OUR MISSION

This election year has been a crazy one! From the very scary rhetoric bouncing around at the national level, to local election workers under threat, to legislation which criminalized our voter registration work, it has been a challenging year to say the least. Those in charge of elections in our area say it has been their most trying year to date. However, I can say with great admiration that we have risen to these challenges. Our members donated more than 10,000 volunteer hours, more than \$15,000, and immense skill so that we could make a difference in our community in 2022. This year, with billboards, bus ads, printed flyers, voter guides, community programs, media attention, and personal contact, we reached an astounding 2,116,687 voters in our five county service area! The November election was calmer than anyone predicted. There were no armed "monitors" at our polls (at least none that I heard about), there were few long lines, and I have heard only a few losing candidates declare that the election was stolen. I believe the efforts of voting rights organizations, including ours, have made a difference, have made things better.

We also had fun. I grew up in the League, as did my brother Jim (our esteemed eVoter editor.) The League helped my mom fulfill her desire to work toward a better future for her community (she and her League friends were instrumental to getting a new high school built), but it was also an important social outlet for her. She and the other LWV Emporia members were there for each other and usually had a good time. I'm happy to report that while the stakes are as high as they have ever been, Leaguers can still manage to have some fun! (I'm jealous I didn't get to work the Lizzo concert.) I'm proud to be part of such an optimistic, hard working, supportive activist community.

But alas, we still have work to do. The election saboteurs are still out there, waiting. As we start to plan for the 2023 and 2024 elections, we must be strategic and deliberate. We must continue to involve new members, grow our leadership, and develop ways to raise the money we need to do our good works. We must think about the threats to democracy lurking around the corner and head them off at the pass. We must be efficient, deliberate, and brave. I look at the numbers in this report and I know we will rise to the occasion. We will Empower Voters and Defend Democracy.







The Election Protection Team helped people get curbside voting, provided palm cards that explained the new ID rules, assisted people so they did not leave without voting, and helped voters understand provisional voting.

In a new partnership with The Kansas City Public Library, LWVKC presented Ballot Measures Explained, an educational program defining the statewide ballot measures voters saw on their ballots in November 2022. We presented this program at six locations around the metro and online. In a partnership with Revolución Educativa, the program was presented in Spanish as well as English.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The Legislative Action team created a new system to track bills and produced Calls to Action for our members and other concerned citizens. We reached hundreds of voters each week and asked them to take Five for Democracy by calling legislators, submitting testimony to the Missouri House of Representatives, or sharing our social media posts. Listeners were kept up to date on the goings-on at the state house with a weekly Legislative Action Talk Talk Vote! Podcast. This year we are excited to be taking our system state-wide, avoiding duplication of effort and enabling greater collaboration between local Leagues!
